# NH State Director of Referee Assessment Annual Report 2018

1. Overall 416 assessments were conducted this year for 103 referees. A breakdown of the leagues in which written assessments were provided is below.

2. Referees continued to seek upgrade and maintenance assessments. A breakdown of maintenance and upgrade assessments is below.

- 3. Assessments were conducted by 13 by different assessors.
- 4. The SDA worked with the SDI to provide instructors and assessors at the NHSL Jamboree in August. Referees were able to receive on the field training and feedback during dynamic games.
- 5. Assessors represented NH at the Region 1 Presidents' Cup, Region 1 ODP Tournament, and Region 1 National Championships.
- 6. Leagues which provided unrestricted access to real time assignments electronically were continued to be provided free assessments to referees in the leagues.
- 7. The SDA attended the US Soccer Referee Administrator workshop in Dallas, Texas in March.
- 8. The SDA was invited to participate in an Education Workgroup to develop the New Grassroots Referee training modules by US Soccer at the Pinnacle National Development Center in Kansas City, KS. This consisted of multiple trips to collaborate with other stakeholders from across the country and US Soccer regarding the development of this new course.
- 9. The SDA participated in quarterly conference calls with US Soccer and other administrators from across the country to collaborate regarding interpretations of the Laws of the Game and best practices.
- 10. The SDA teamed with NH assessors throughout the year to ensure a consistent message and rating system was being used in the state.
- 11. The SDA and other State Assessors mentored assessors on the mechanics and skills of assessments.
- 12. The SDA communicated with US Soccer staff in Chicago, NDA, and other NH SRC members regarding changes in the referee requirements and assessment program.
- 13. An assessor mentoring program was implemented throughout the year. Assessors were encouraged to do assessments in teams with a lead and secondary assessor. This allowed assessors to work with each other to improve their assessing skills.

## NH State Director of Referee Instruction Annual Report 2018

- 1. New referees are required to be certified by USSF. In New Hampshire, this is done by taking an online course on the basic laws of the game, attending a 5-hour classroom session and a 2-hour field session to certify the new referees. The online course contains two modules on concussion management by US Soccer and the CDC. For the 2018 registration year (July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018), 298 new referees were certified through 11 Entry Level Grade 8 classes. For the 2019 registration year (July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019) as of December 31, 2018, 138 new referees were certified through 5 Entry Level Grade 8 classes.
- 2. Each year referees are required to be recertified to receive update to the laws of the games, advanced training and points of emphasis. In New Hampshire, this is done by taking on online review of law changes and a 2-hour classroom training. For the 2018 registration year (July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018), 531 referees attended one of 23 In Service Training sessions to be recertified. For the 2019 registration year (July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019) as of December 31, 2018, 134 referees attended one of 7 In Service Training sessions to be recertified.
- 3. Futsal certification is an 8 hour class and annual recertification is a 2-hour training. The online course contains two modules on concussion management by US Soccer and the CDC. In 2018, 38 referees were recertified through 2 in service training sessions.
- 4. An advanced training session was held in March. Attendance at an advanced training session is required of all advanced grade referees and invitations are extended to other officials who are seeking advancement. The March session was led by USSF National Referee Coach Kermit Quisenberry.
- 5. All instructors have completed the SafeSport online course.
- 6. There were 10 registered instructors for 2018. There are two certified futsal instructors.
- 7. The SDI attended the US Soccer Referee Administrator workshop in Dallas, Texas in March.
- 8. The SDI was invited to participate in an Education Workgroup to develop the New Grassroots Referee training modules by US Soccer at the Pinnacle National Development Center in Kansas City, KS. This consisted of multiple trips to collaborate with other stakeholders from across the country and US Soccer regarding the development of this new course.
- 9. The SDI participated in quarterly conference calls with US Soccer, SDI's and other administrators from across the country to collaborate regarding interpretations of the Laws of the Game and best practices.
- 10. The SDI communicated with US Soccer staff in Chicago, NDA, and other NH SRC members regarding changes in the referee requirements and assessment program.
- 11. The instructional program, in conjunction with the assessment program, provided instructors for field session training at the NHSL fall jamboree.

State Director of (Referee) Instruction (SDI) Proposal State Referee Committee (SRC) Meeting: January 2019

### New Grassroots Referee Course Updates

- All participants must sign a liability waiver to participate in the course. Instructors will need to email this out prior to the class for the referee candidates to print, sign (or have an adult sign if under the age of 18), and bring to the course. They will not be able to participate in the field session without the signed paper. It is suggested instructors have some extra copies that can be signed by a parent at the start of the class session. Instructors should keep the waiver for 30 days; if a participant is injured, the waiver form should be sent to the SDI to keep as a record.
- The goal for the field session portion will be to have one instructor / coach / mentor per five referee candidates. This will allow more personalized feedback during dynamic drills.

Instructors will need to be First Aid / CPR certified. While referees do not deal with injuries to players during a game, injuries to course participants may occur during a field session. Instructors will need to be First Aid / CPR certified to deal with any potential injuries that may occur (if anything serious, it is recommended to call 911). Instructors will also need to call parents if the individual is a minor and document any injuries. A procedure to this effect will be developed. Certification will be done through the American Red Cross.
